CRISIS STABILIZATION UNITS

3,155 adults and children received immediate psychiatric help at our Bartow or Lakeland Crisis Stabilization Units

MOBILE CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM

11,925 individuals received immediate crisis support by calling our crisis line, visiting one of our Crisis Campuses, or through our Community Mobile Support Team (CMST). The CMST works with local law enforcement to assist with mental health related calls/cases.

OUTPATIENT SERVICES FY22

CARE COORDINATION

248 individuals living with severe mental illness, severe emotional disturbance and co-occurring disorders were linked to services that support their overall well-being



MEDICATION MANAGEMENT

5,747 adults and adolescents received medication management assistance and routine psychiatric evaluations



OUTPATIENT THERAPY

5,828 individuals worked with therapists to develop individualized treatment plans to help reach their mental health, wellness and recovery goals



SUBSTANCE USE SERVICES

304 individuals, families and others affected received substance use treatment and recovery-focused services

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

71 at-risk youth/young adults with a mental health or co-occurring substance use disorder received comprehensive, intensive treatment through **COMMUNITY ACTION TREATMENT (CAT) TEAM**

129 families served by **HOME TO STAY** received in-home crisis intervention/stabilization through case management support as well as educational skills in an effort to keep their children in the home

236 children and their families received therapeutic treatment and case management support thanks to the **RESILIENCY TEAM**



COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES

40 parents facing child welfare involvement and experiencing substance use challenges received integrated support through **FAMILY INTENSIVE TREATMENT (FIT) TEAM**

111 people with a severe and persistent mental illness received comprehensive treatment, rehabilitation and support services through **FLORIDA ASSERTIVE COMMUNITY TREATMENT (FACT) TEAM**

13 adolescents and young adults who recently had unusual thoughts and behaviors received help achieving their goals for school, work and relationships thanks to our new program **ONTRACK**



RECOVERY SERVICES

360 individuals were linked to community resources and received help planning and monitoring short and long-term recovery goals through **ADULT CASE MANAGEMENT**

106 individuals with a mental illness worked alongside staff to oversee clubhouse operations, build job skills and develop meaningful relationships at **CLUB SUCCESS**

446 individuals involved in the criminal justice system received community monitoring and resource linkage through **FORENSIC SERVICES**

71 clients received structured psychoeducation, group support, and help developing a variety of life skills at **PSYCHOSOCIAL REHABILITATION SERVICES (PSR)**



RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

29 individuals had affordable, quality **HOUSING** through PRC's Group Home and Apartments

57 high-risk patients received extended psychiatric rehabilitation in our **SHORT-TERM RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FACILITY**, a safe and therapeutic environment

WELLNESS SERVICES

642 qualified Polk County residents at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level received primary health care services at our **WELLNESS CLINIC**

2,647 patients received **INTEGRATED HEALTH CARE SERVICES** to meet both their behavioral health and physical health needs through PRC's Wellness Clinic

VICTIM SERVICES

596 adults and children utilized **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTER SERVICES**

331 individuals received free and confidential sexual assault services through our **RAPE RECOVERY PROGRAM**

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
