Recovery Services



We define recovery services as services available to individuals who have a severe and persistent mental illness.

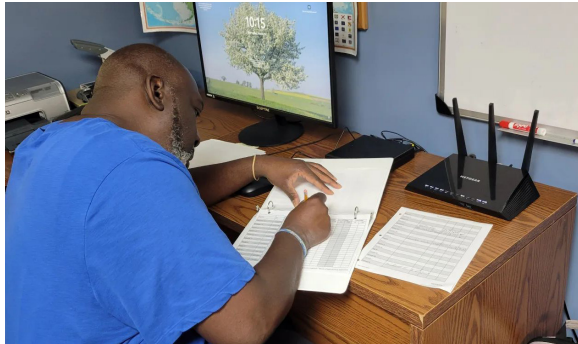
Mental illness isn't anything to be ashamed about. It's an illness. The main difference is that it effects the brain. So, reclaim your life; recovery is possible.

Adult Case Management

Assesses individuals with mental illnesses for service needs and links them to community resources such as social security, Medicaid/Medicare, and food stamps. Assists in planning short- and long-term recovery goals while monitoring progress on reaching the goals. Advocates for individuals' recovery.

Adult Residential Treatment

Assists severely and persistently mentally ill residents in the development and refining of daily living skills so they may attain the goal of living in the least restrictive environment possible. Develops treatment plans to pair the resident's strengths with their personal goals. Residents may also receive medication management, case management, vocational, forensic, and/or psychosocial rehabilitation services.



Club Success

A rehabilitation club for people with mental illness where real-life job skills are taught and used to achieve "meaningful work" as a contributing member of society. Club members learn responsibility, develop self-esteem and learn to interact professionally. Provides transitional employment with local community partners, guidance to secure housing and/or advance one's education and promotes on-going psychiatric care, while maintaining government benefits.

Psychosocial Rehabilitation

Provides opportunities for personal growth and empowerment in a group setting through classes designed to develop and enhance skills necessary for improved mental health and recovery. Builds on the strengths and capabilities of each individual, while encouraging hope and promoting respect, and believes all individuals have the capacity for learning and growth. Evidence-based curriculum is designed to address individuals' unique needs consistent with their treatment goals and aspirations.



Supported Employment

Develops emotional, social and employment skills necessary to secure job placement. Provides opportunities to try various jobs to assess interest and skill level, and provides opportunities to work in the community for a competitive wage with a job coach working to maximize the client's opportunity for success.
