SERVICES OVERVIEW

Therapeutic Behavioral On-Site (TBOS) Services

- Weekly individual therapy sessions in the home and school setting provided by a Masters level therapist
- Includes both the client and family in developing a unique treatment plan to address specific, clientcentered goals

Targeted Case Management (TCM)

- Monthly school and home visits to access, plan, link, monitor, and advocate supportive services for the child
- Individualized support to the child and family with community linkage to improve quality of mental health and family dynamics
- Coordination with other agencies such as Department of Children and Families (DCF), Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), mental health providers, and schools in order to ensure continuity of care

Parenting Support (16 sessions over 4-6 months)

- Weekly one-on-one supervision with parents to establish and strengthen positive, appropriate parenting skills for children diagnosed with a mental illness and to address caregiver selfcare/compassion fatigue
- Weekly school or home visits with the child to provide mentoring support
- Coordination with child's therapist and targeted case manager to ensure continuity of care



BENEFITS OF THERAPEUTIC SUPPORT

- Evidence-based services with proven success
- Improved advocacy for mental health needs
- Multi-disciplinary approach with child, parent, and teacher involvement
- Strengthened emotional intelligence and regulation of behavior
- Increased coping skills to improve both academic and social interactions
- Reduced recidivism of Baker Acts

Resiliency Team Services can help with:

- Poor listening/communication
- Disrespectful behavior
- · Lack of following directions
- Verbal/physical aggression
- Truancy

Services are provided at no direct cost to the individual.

REFERRAL AND INTAKE PROCESS

TBOS services and parenting referrals must be completed by the current mental health provider.

Targeted Case Management (TCM) referrals may be completed by current mental health and medical providers, school staff, Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), or the Department of Children and Families (DCF).

Criteria for TBOS and TCM Services:

- Between the ages of birth to 17
- IQ above 70
- Diagnosed mental health disability (serious emotional disturbance) that will last for at least one year
- Requires services to assist in attaining self-sufficiency and satisfaction in the living, learning, work, and social environments of choice
- Lacks a natural support system for accessing needed medical, social, educational, and other services
- Requires ongoing assistance to access or maintain needed care consistently within the service delivery system
- Is in an out of home placement or at risk for out of home placement
- Is not receiving duplicate services
